**DEFAULT IMAGE:** Side profile, sport coat, left hand thumbs up — no threat. Lefty is the only TIM model with a side-profile stance. The waistband is not visible, making the sport coat pocket the secondary overlay position for concealed weapon scenarios. All left hand overlays attach via one RapidSwap magnet. The sport coat pocket concealed gun attaches independently via the second magnet — both positions can be used simultaneously. **Important:** Lefty's left-hand presentation specifically counters right-side visual bias that develops from repetitive right-hand-only training.

7	Handgun — left hand extended	Empty	THREAT	Left-hand weapon presentation — counters right-side visual bias
8	Handgun — left hand extended	Concealed gun — sport coat pocket	THREAT	Dual weapon — handgun in hand + concealed weapon in pocket

<b>KEY</b>	<b>THREAT — Active threat. Shoot decision may be warranted.</b>	<b>ELEVATED — Weapon present but not actively threatening. Assess and challenge.</b>	<b>NO-THREAT / MOF RISK — No weapon. High MOF risk in low light. No shoot.</b>	<b>NO-THREAT — No weapon. No shoot.</b>

**INSTRUCTOR NOTE:** Lefty is specifically designed to counter right-side visual bias. Officers who train exclusively with right-hand threat presentations develop a pattern recognition shortcut that can fail in real encounters. Always run Lefty drills in direct sequence with TIM 1 to break assumption-based scanning. The flashlight and umbrella scenarios are most effective in low-light conditions — run these at 50 lux or below for maximum training value. The sport coat pocket concealed weapon requires officers to scan the full body, not just the hands.
